

Cosmic Views Addendum: The A.M. chart for Hillary (and a special offer) By Carole Devine

A reader has requested a delineation of Hillary's a.m. chart, since there are so many people who use it, and also because there are equally compelling sources for it. I checked out Rodden's Astro Data Bank and found that although they chose to use 8:00 p.m., it is considered DD (dirty data), and it goes on to list many people who verify both times (i.e. 8:00 p.m. and 8:02 a.m.) including citing her mother's memory and Hillary, herself, who both said it was a.m. (I've known mother's memories to mix up their children's birth times, and Hillary could just be echoing what her mother said. I also read somewhere that Hillary told someone she had Leo rising, which would put the time way off from these two!) But, fair enough. We'll examine the a.m. chart.

Hillary Clinton: Character

The a.m. chart shows 21 Scorpio rising with her 21 Scorpio Mercury right on the ascendant. This reminds me of a dilemma in class when I was learning rectification from Gina Ceaglio in California. She had two possible times for her husband—one a.m. and the other p.m., but in one, Gemini was rising with Pluto on the ascendant (honorary Scorpio rising because Pluto rules Scorpio), and the other *was* Scorpio rising, so she still couldn't tell just by character traits. It is the same thing here; Mercury is rising in the Scorpio rising chart, and since Mercury rules Gemini, we get a Gemini flavor. The fact that her Sun sign is Scorpio doesn't help, since of course, it gives her strong Scorpio traits. In the p.m. chart Gemini is rising. (This makes me want to scream, argggghh!)

The a.m. chart gives her a 12th house Sun in the Koch system of houses, which I use. That can indicate a person who prefers behind-the-scenes work—somewhat of a loner. However, it adds to her compassion for masses of people that I think she genuinely has. Since the Moon is solidly in Pisces and trine the ascendant and Mercury from the fourth, we have evidence of her superior mothering ability and why she would write a book like *It Takes a Village*. The ruler of the ascendant, however, is Pluto, and it is in the ninth with the other two Leo planets, Saturn and Mars. That would indicate a passion for politics and law and a global presence. But Saturn squares the ascendant, an indication of self-doubt; it is offset by Jupiter rising—not conjunct the Ascendant, but in the first house—so she feels optimistic about herself. It is interesting to note that Pluto was transiting the Ascendant during her husband's first campaign for the presidency and was still in range when she fought for health care reform. That is quite compelling, but it would have been in range to aspect Mercury in the other chart, so is not conclusive.

This chart does not have the ego issues as strongly represented as the other chart. Instead the karma revolves around learning to compromise and negotiate (north node in the 7th) as well as learning to trust in her own abilities to earn a living and handle material substance (same node in Taurus). There are, however, still three planets in Leo, all in stressful aspect to Venus and Mercury, and that may be enough to interject some ego lessons; it just isn't as strong as the other chart. These are all in cadent houses, as well, showing much of it being unconscious, but not as firmly entrenched as when some of them were in the fixed fifth house of the p.m. chart. Plus, when so much of this energy is in the 12th and 9th, the "prickly" personality that is still there would be quite hidden. The

Mercury/Moon trine would be more prominent (and especially with Jupiter rising), so we'd see a loving, caring and charming person on the surface. Often we do see that.

Clinton: Forecast

Solar arc Moon was right on the north node about three months ago, which can indicate one participating in a karmic event that would be very emotional. It's in the seventh—the public and also some issues with her husband, who has been quite visible in this campaign. Progressed Moon is also in the seventh and rules the ninth (politics, government, etc.) and is just leaving a square to progressed Mars, showing a very recent annoyance. We pointed out in the last analysis that Neptune is transiting opposite her Saturn and square Mercury, so it is still doing that here, but it is also square the ascendant. That doesn't confirm the time because Mercury and Saturn being activated are enough to elicit her confusion. What is missing here is the transit of Pluto playing a part. It is only conjoining progressed Mercury, which it did in the previous chart, too. It does make minor aspects to Mars and Pluto, but it also did in the other chart.

In both charts the MC is not really radically different (re being activated) since they are within a few minutes of being in opposite places. So a planet can conjunct or oppose it, and it will produce similar results. In this one, Hillary's Saturn is at the MC—just about exact—an indication of a culmination of a career. In my previous thumbnail sketches of the candidates, I mentioned that Saturn had already passed Obama's MC, an indication of consolidating a position, having already reached his peak for this cycle a little while ago. When Bush was first campaigning in early to middle 1998, Saturn was on his MC. This cycle is very reliable in showing ascending rise in career, peaking and waning. Conjoining the MC is the peak for that cycle. If one stays in a career for more than one cycle, there can be two peaks, of course, and we may see more of Obama, whether he is president this time or not.

If, indeed, this a.m. chart is correct for Clinton, and she loses, then she would probably go into obscurity, working behind the scenes and not try this again, considering her age, and this is a 28 to 30 year cycle. If the p.m. chart is correct, she could come into prominence again in fourteen years—for whatever reason. This period now would not be the peak of her career.

Using this chart, she is still happy in early March. And has a new lease on things in late April when Uranus trines her Mercury and after that her ascendant in mid May. In this chart the new player is Uranus which is passing over the changed Moon position from the other chart. It also makes wonderful aspects to the Ascending cluster, too. Jupiter also sextiles the ascendant in late May, another “good news” indicator. Uranus stations very close to her Moon, but not partile, on June 26th. She could be accident prone then, very impatient or just have a hectic time of it. Saturn is on the MC again on July 5th.

It is late July—around the 23rd to 29th—when some real stress surfaces. Pluto is transiting progressed Mercury at the same time that both are sesquiquadrate Mars. That's rage and no mincing words about it, either. The August eclipses are even more prominent in this chart since they now include the Ascendant, too.

She is very happy at convention time. Uranus is again trine Mercury, Ascendant and south node, plus on the 26th progressed Moon is sextile Mars—a good sign she'd get the nomination if this chart is right. She is disoriented in late September when Neptune squares the ascendant, and rather annoyed in late October. However, late October has

some interesting energy. If the chart is valid, then the solar arc ascendant is trine and sextile the nodes—a positive, destined event. On November 2nd, very close to Election Day and quite potent, progressed Mars sextiles progressed MC. That is a vigorous injection of positive energy for her career. I'd conjecture that she has a better chance at the presidency with this chart than with the other.

Also, if you had a chart done recently and don't necessarily need it, then you can still do next year. We just start where the previous one ended. If there is a big response, it may take a little longer to schedule them, but we'll get it all done.

I hope this is successful, because I want to document what I do with all these tools in trading and share it with all of you when I know what works and what doesn't.
